



## Player Movement within Tri-Cities (Parent\Trainer Coached) Travel Policy

### Player Movement during Soccer year (Fall\Spring Season)

- Player commitment is for one year (two seasons, Fall and Spring) to original team.
- Coaches are not allowed to recruit or attempt to sway players from one team to move to their team during the soccer year.
- If player\parent is not satisfied with a current team situation they should try to resolve with coach first and if they are not able to resolve it, then please contact Tri-Cities office for assistance (630-377-1101).

### Player Tryouts:

- Open tryouts are in June (Premier or Parent\Trainer Coached) of each year.
- A player\parent must notify his\her current coach a minimum of two weeks prior to tryouts, of their child's playing status.
- Coaches should encourage parent/child to play at the appropriate level

Player Status:	Description:	Outcome\Action:
Guaranteed Spot	Player has place on existing team the following season	Player must commit verbally to coach two weeks prior to June tryouts
Reserved Spot	Player announces intent to stay with TCSA but would like to try another team	If player makes another team, good for him/her. If not, original team holds a spot for them
Change of Compatibility	Player is not asked to return to team due to player/parent conflict or player compatibility	Player can tryout for another TCSA team (Premier, Parent Coached, Recreational).



### **Coach's Responsibility:**

- If a coach will need a player prior to open tryouts, the coach should contact the Tri-Cities Office.
- Coaches are not allowed to recruit from other clubs during the soccer year (Fall\Spring). Tri-Cities Soccer and/or the Coach can be penalized if caught recruiting.
- If an existing coach's child makes the jump to premier, they should discuss with the parents to see if another parent is willing to take over. If not, then a paid professional coach could be available for an additional fee.
- Coach's have until two weeks before tryouts to talk to families about next year's playing status. Coach's have the obligation to work with the family to determine child status as outlined above.
- If any dispute arises about player placement, contact Tri-Cities office.
